THE PAD Welcome to one stylish Tardis. This pimped-up bungalow, hidden down a sandy lane, has a lust-worthy kitchen, dining room and pantry, plus a luxe snug with huge velvet corner sofa and pretty pink bathrooms complete with rain showers and a bath. Three double bedrooms and a double bunk bed room sees it sleep 10, plus two canine companions. A hamper of local treats awaits, too, along with board games and a small garden. It's worth flagging that this place sits between other homes, so lacks idyllic views.

EXPLORE The glorious sands of Camber beach stretch for miles, and scrambling up the dunes is a must. The town

itself is less pretty, but new lifestyle shop/deli/ coffee bar Camber Landing serves negronis, £9, alongside handsome pastries and

quiches, £3.75. There are three vineyards within half an hour's drive, too. Stroll around Chapel Down on an entertaining tour, before trying its moreish Bacchus white wine. Tours with tastings cost from £30 per person (Chapeldown.com). Meanwhile, historic Rye is just 10 minutes away, with cute shops and a crazily good antiques scene. For gorgeous gifts – both modern and vintage – call in at Lola & Sidney (Lolaandsidney.com). For eclectic local art and organic beauty picks, seek out Ethel Loves Me (Ethelloves.me). REFUEL Drop into the Whitehouse in Rye

for fluffy pancakes with blueberries and vanilla mascarpone, £12, and breakfast quesadillas with black beans, chipotle salsa and lime pickled onions, £13. Only fools would skip the cakes, like the cherry

crumble, £3.50 (Whitehouserye.co.uk). Book The Fig for a cosy dinner of delicious small plates, such as cheese souffle tart, £11, and spicy prawn tacos, £11. Finish off the night with a vodka-and-vermouth-based Turkish Delight cocktail, £10 (Thefigrye.com). Staying in? Stock up on supplies, including Romney Marsh lamb, from Salts Farm Shop, just minutes from Camber (Saltsfarmshop.co.uk).

DON'T MISS Rye's quirky Waterworks micro-pub is housed in an old pump house. Order a pint of the house IPA and a Red Love cider, £4 each, as well as a home-made Scotch egg, or three (Ryewaterworks.co.uk).

BOOK IT A stay at Seagrass, sleeping 10, costs from £311 per night (Camberholiday cottages.co.uk/seagrass).

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
